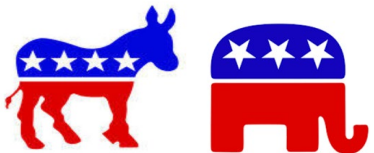

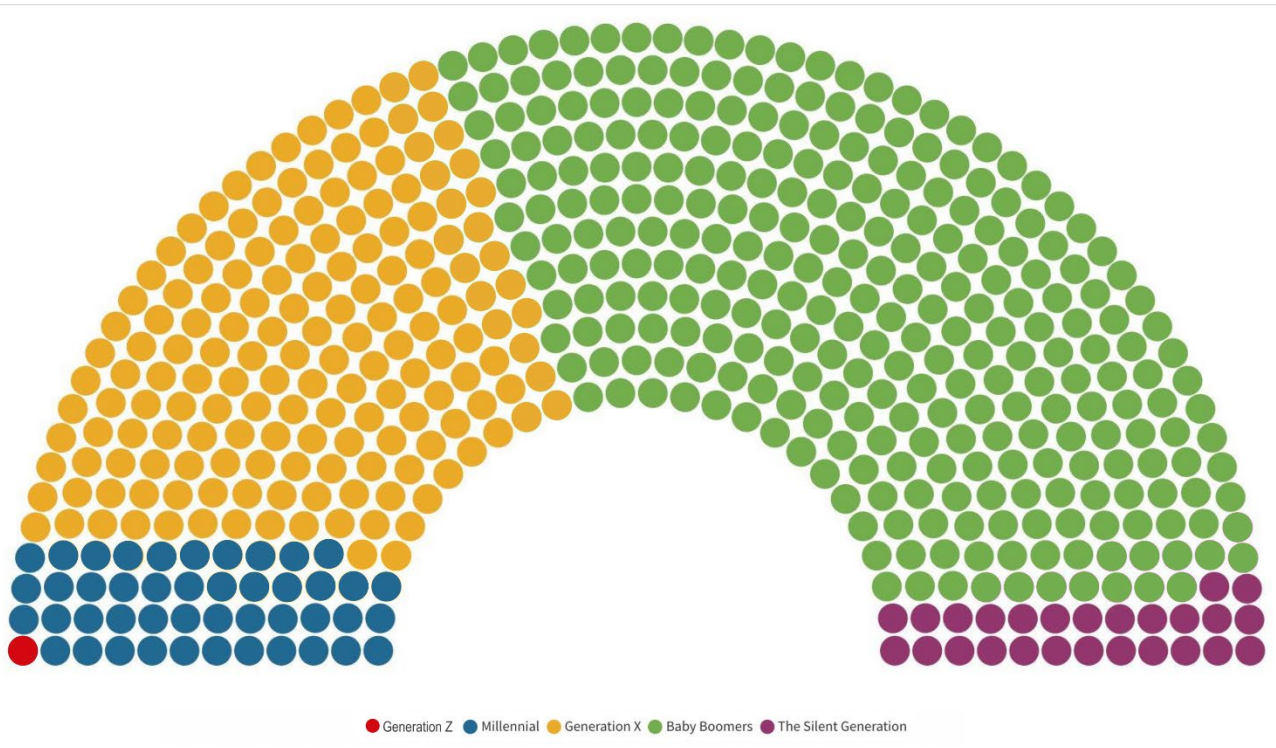

2022



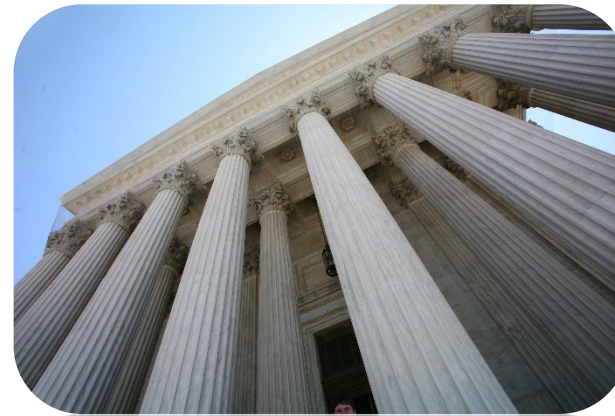
- Headlining the generational gap in Congress is newly elected Representative Maxwell Frost (D-FL). Rep.-elect Frost is the first member of “Gen Z” (those born after 1996) to be elected to Congress. There will be XX Millennials, XXX members of Gen. X, and XXX Baby Boomers. The Silent Generation will be represented by XXX Congressmen and women.*
- The average age for house members in congress is XXX years old, while the average senator is XXX years of age.*
- There is greater than a 60-year gap between the nation's oldest lawmakers, Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) and Sen. Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa), and the youngest, Rep.-elect Maxwell Frost (D-FL).

118th Congress – Oversight-Focused Agenda

2022

Republican-Led Oversight Focus

- Should Republicans win either house of Congress, they are planning a robust oversight and investigations agenda.
- Investigations of the Biden Administration's actions, including energy policies, measures related to the COVID-19 pandemic, decisions related to the southern border, and other matters in the lead-up to the 2024 presidential campaign
- Historically, Republican congresses have focused on oversight of the Executive Branch when the President is a Democrat. Incoming Republican oversight leaders have made clear that much of their investigations will focus on sectors outside of government as well, including Big Tech, Green Tech, ESG efforts, and beneficiaries of Biden Administration spending programs.



Lame Duck Legislative Priorities

2022

- Appropriations
 - Congress must pass spending package by December 16 deadline; a continuing resolution (CR) passed in September to fund the federal government until then. Potential measures that will be included in the final spending bill:
 - Hurricane Aid – FEMA’s disaster relief fund meets immediate needs, but won’t last forever
 - Targeted military aid for Ukraine – \$12 billion has been spent on aid so far, with the White House announcing further spending in September
- National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA)
 - House passed version by 329-101 vote in July (H.R. 7900)
 - Topline funding \$839.3 billion; includes 4.6% pay raise for troops; requires tougher gender-neutral fitness standards; increases funding for cybersecurity and AI development
 - Senate has yet to announce a date for a floor vote but aims to enact final bill by December 31. (S. 4543)
- Respect for Marriage Act (H.R. 8404)
 - Senate pushed a vote on a same-sex marriage bill to codify the right into federal law until after the midterm elections.
 - Passed the House in July with nearly 50 Republicans joining Democrats by a margin of 267-157.

Lame Duck Legislative Priorities (Cont.)

2022

- Electoral Count Reform and Presidential Transition Improvement Act (S.4573)
 - Introduced on July 20; the bill revises aspects of the electoral vote-counting process, among other things
 - Senate Committee on Rules and Administration voted 14-1 in favor of the bill with bipartisan support
 - Senate has yet to announce future actions on the bill, but aims to proceed following the midterm recess
- Tax
 - As a tax extender package is negotiated for the lame-duck legislative session, key components may include:
 - Retirement security package
 - Updated research & development amortization fix
 - Individual child tax credit relief
 - There are only a few more major legislative vehicles to attach a tax extender package to this year, most likely an omnibus appropriations bill, or the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).
- Judicial Nominations
 - As the balance of power is shifting, Democrat lawmakers are keen on processing more of their judicial nominations while they are still in the majority
 - To date, the Biden Administration has already appointed nearly 180 judges
